AGRICULTURAL COLLEGES (DOMESTIC AND GENERAL STAFF) AWARD - STATE 2003

(Gazette, 2 May 2003)

PURSUANT to the Declaration of the Commission as to a General Ruling made on 21 August 2009, the said Award is amended as follows as from 1 September 2009:

1. By deleting clause 5.8 and inserting the following in lieu thereof:

5.8 Wage rates

The wages payable to employees under this Award are expressed as fortnightly rates and are as follows:

The rates of pay in this clause comprise the minimum rates payable under this Award.

The rates incorporate adjustments based upon the Agricultural Colleges of Queensland Certified Agreement 2000 (CA70 of 2001).

The rates of pay in this Award are intended to include the arbitrated wage adjustment payable under the 1 September 2009 Declaration of General Ruling and earlier Safety Net Adjustments and arbitrated wage adjustments. This

arbitrated wage adjustment may be offset against any equivalent amount in rates of pay received by employees whose wages and conditions of employment are regulated by this Award which are above the wage rates prescribed in the Award. Such payments include wages payable pursuant to certified agreements, currently operating enterprise flexibility agreements, Queensland workplace agreements, award amendments to give effect to enterprise agreements and overaward arrangements. Absorption which is contrary to the terms of an agreement is not required.

Increases made under previous State Wage Cases or under the current Statement of Principles, excepting those resulting from enterprise agreements, are not to be used to offset arbitrated wage adjustments.

2. By deleting from the clauses listed in the first column of the Schedule, the amount in the second column, and inserting the amount in the third column in lieu thereof:
