Reasons for Decision

- [1] On 27 August 2020, the State of Queensland (Department of Transport and Main Roads) ("the Applicant") applied, pursuant to s 228(1)(a) of the *Industrial Relations Act 2016* ("the Act"), to terminate the *Transport and Main Roads Operational Employees' Certified Agreement 2016* ("the certified agreement").
- [2] The certified agreement has a nominal expiry date of 31 August 2019.
- [3] I have considered the affidavit of Mr Neil Scales, Director-General, Department of Transport and Main Roads, affirmed on 26 August 2020.
- [4] Having regard to the material relied upon in support of the application, I have concluded that the certified agreement does not include any provisions recording that any particular conditions need to be met before it may be terminated.¹

- [5] I am satisfied that the Applicant has given notice of its intention to apply to terminate the certified agreement;² that the other parties to the certified agreement agree to its being terminated;³ and that the termination of the certified agreement is not contrary to the public interest.⁴
- [6] Section 228(4) of the Act provides that termination takes effect when the Commission's approval takes effect.
- [7] I approve the termination of the *Transport and Main Roads Operational Employees' Certified Agreement 2016* with effect from 3 September 2020.
- [8] I make the following order:
 - 1. The Transport and Main Roads Operational Employees' Certified Agreement 2016 is terminated.
