PRACTICE DIRECTION NUMBER 7 OF 2021

INDUSTRIAL COURT OF QUEENSLAND

ROBING

The Members of the Industrial Court of Queensland and Counsel appearing before the Court will, subject to the provisions below, wear robes in Court.

- 1. Robes are to be worn for:
 - (a) trials;
 - (b) appeals; and
 - (c) all other final hearings.
- 2. Robes are not required to be worn for the hearing of reviews or mentions.
- 3. The Court may, on its own motion or on the application of any party, and after having regard to the nature or circumstances of a particular matter, rule that robes are not to be worn for a particular hearing or matter.
- 4. For Counsel, 'robes' means the robes customarily worn by Counsel appearing in the Supreme Court of Queensland. Wigs, full-bottomed or otherwise, are not worn on any occasion.
- 5. Facilities are available on the floor used by the Court in Central Plaza Two for Counsel to robe.
