The Applicant is celebrating its 25-year anniversary and intends to host a range of events in celebration on 26 December 2025 pursuant to the Grounds of this application (and annexures) to celebrate this unique occasion.

5. Grounds of Application

- 1. The "Light Up 25" (the Event) is intended to take place between the hours of 9am and 9pm on Friday, 26 December 2025.
- 2. The Event is intended to take place at Harbour Town Retail Outlets at Biggera Waters.
- 3. Harbour Town Premium Outlets is set to illuminate the Gold Coast with Light up 25, a spectacular celebration marking the centre's 25th anniversary. This unforgettable evening will showcase a breathtaking bespoke light show that transforms the outlet into a visual wonderland, complemented by a dazzling fireworks display that will light up the night sky. With live entertainment from a DJ, whilst local radio stations will be broadcasting live from the event with exciting on-air activations. The festivities will feature incredible prize giveaways throughout the night, giving customers the chance to win amazing rewards. With so much to experience, Light up 25 promises to be a milestone celebration that honours a quarter-century of premium retail and unforgettable shopping experiences at one of Queensland's most beloved destinations.
- 4. The Applicant intends to offer a range of unique experiences to its patrons, including:
 - a. A bespoke lightshow
 - b. Fireworks
 - c. Roving Entertainment
 - d. DJ
 - e. Quarter of a Century Giveaways
 - f. Activations by Hot Tomato
- The extended trading hours until 9pm for Light up 25 represent a significant opportunity for Harbour Town Premium Outlets to contribute to the Gold Coast's thriving night-time economy. With the centre rarely trading past 7pm, this special evening offers retailers an exceptional chance to capture additional revenue from both tourists and locals who are seeking evening entertainment and shopping experiences. The event is designed to attract visitors from across South East Queensland and beyond, positioning Harbour Town as not just a daytime shopping destination but as an after-dark entertainment precinct. By combining retail with spectacular entertainment, the extended hours will encourage guests to spend more time at the centre, enjoy dinner at on-site restaurants, and make

purchases they might not otherwise have had the opportunity to complete. This strategic extension of trading hours demonstrates Harbour Town's commitment to supporting its retail partners' economic growth whilst simultaneously enhancing the region's reputation as a diverse and vibrant destination that caters to visitors and residents well into the evening.

- 6. In its application under section 31A of the *Trading (Allowable Hours) Act 1990* (**the Act**), the Applicant addresses criteria under section 31B, notably:
 - The Event is a special event, is unique insofar as it is celebrating an historic anniversary, will not be repeated, and is of importance to the local community as well as domestic and international tourists;
 - b. The Event is of cultural significance insofar as it is a local community event during the Christmas Holiday period where families seek new and unique experiences and entertainment;
 - c. The Event will provide a significant economic benefit to the community, both by way of employer tenants who trade in the Applicant's premises, employees who will receive significant penalty rates for working throughout the Event, and to provide a point of difference for tourists who seek alternatives during the holiday period other than the more typical attendance at purely hospitality venues; and
 - d. At the time of the Event, non-exempt shops would otherwise be unable to take advantage of a unique training opportunity which the granting of the application would allow.
- 7. The Commission should also be minded to consider that the Event:
 - Will only be held at Harbour Town Retail Outlets and in its immediate surrounds, pictured in the below map image;



- b. Based on previous attendance on 26 December, the Applicant can expect a patronage of around 94,000 people throughout the course of the day;
- c. Will be heavily marketed and will receive significant media coverage; and
- d. Will make a significant contribution to Queensland's national and international reputation.
- 8. A recent survey of non-exempt retailers conducted by Harbour Town Centre Management has revealed overwhelming support for extended Boxing Day trading hours beyond 6pm, with 78% of retailers voting in favour of the proposal, demonstrating strong confidence in the commercial viability and customer demand for later trading on one of the year's busiest shopping days. This clear majority signals retailer's recognition that extended hours for the Event will maximise sales opportunities and better serve the needs of customers seeking to take advantage of post-Christmas sales into the evening.
